

Environmental volunteering with National Grid

Community venue profile

The park is situated just north of Birmingham in an area of high deprivation. Many local people do not have access to outdoor space and this park provides a valuable resource

Aims of the day

The team leader spoke to Volunteering Matters before the day and wanted to contribute to the local community. The team wanted to engage a large group of 40 staff for team building and building networks within the department. The venue wanted a large amount of work carried out that would significantly improve the local area.

What Happened?

The team arrived at 9am and the team received an introduction and a health and safety briefing from the park rangers. After this the team worked together on a patch of land around the size of a basketball court. The team cut down and removed small trees, brambles and weeds. They then stacked timber in habitat piles and made dead-hedging borders for animals to nest in.

With all this hard work, the team had made a massive transformation to the area by the time the finished at 4pm.
